The Gulf of Mexico is 41% continental slope, 32% continental shelf, and 24% abyssal plain with the greatest depth of 12,467 in sigsbee Deep. The Gulf of Mexico Eastern, northern and northwestern shores lie along the US states of Florida, Alabama, mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas.
